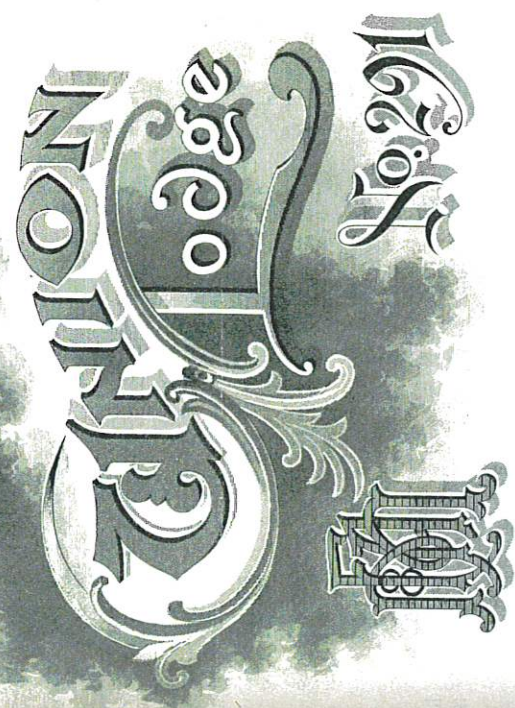

YOUR DUES TO DECEMBER 3, 1943 (Annual Election) ARE - \$

EXTRACTS FROM THE BY-LAWS

ARTICLE II, Section 3—No member shall be entitled to vote at the annual election or be eligible to any office unless his dues shall have been paid in full to the St. John's Day next succeeding such election, or the same duly remitted by vote of the Lodge.

ARTICLE II, Section 4—Before proceeding to the election, the Secretary shall read a list of the members who are in arrears to the Lodge; whereupon the Master shall announce that such members are neither eligible to office nor entitled to vote.

ARTICLE VI, Section 1—The dues of each member shall be twelve dollars per annum, except when otherwise provided by these By-Laws.

ARTICLE VI, Section 2—Any member being in arrears to the Lodge for two or more years on the night of the annual election, and neglecting or refusing to pay the same after he has been summoned by action of the Lodge, at the next preceding stated meeting to pay his arrears, or show cause why he should not be suspended for non-payment thereof, may be suspended from membership; PROVIDED, that before any member be suspended it shall satisfactorily appear to the Lodge that such member has, in addition to such summons, received due notice as required by Article III, Section 3, of these By-Laws, and that the provisions of the Ahiman Rezon have been fully complied with.
